- Develop the D&I workforce in cancer prevention and control

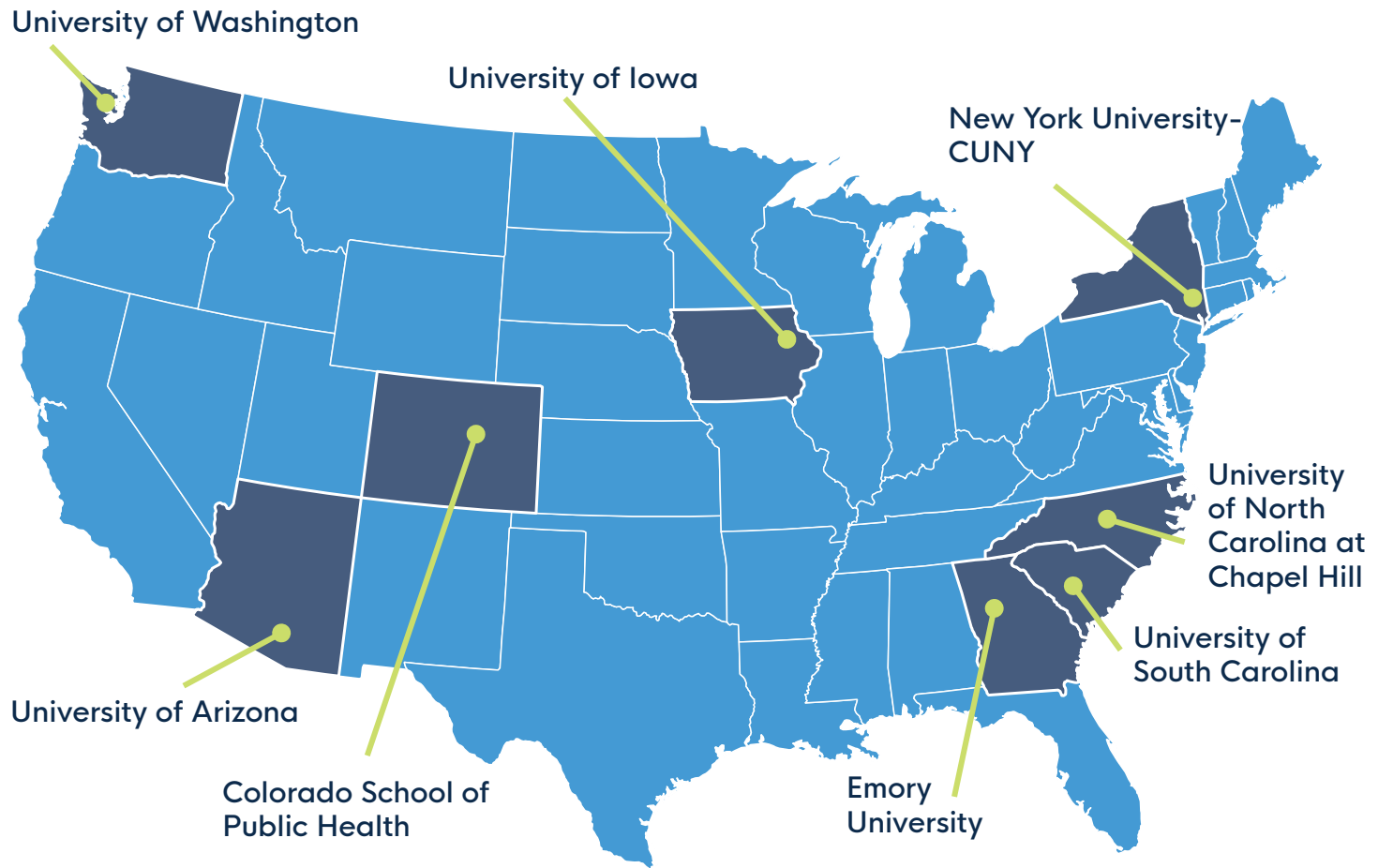
CPCRNR Vision

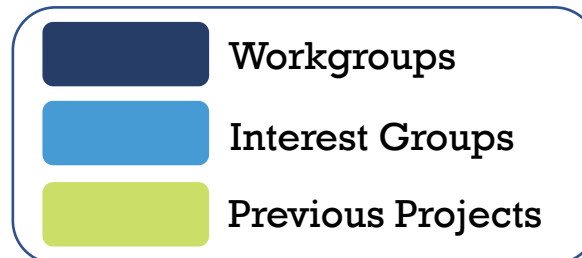
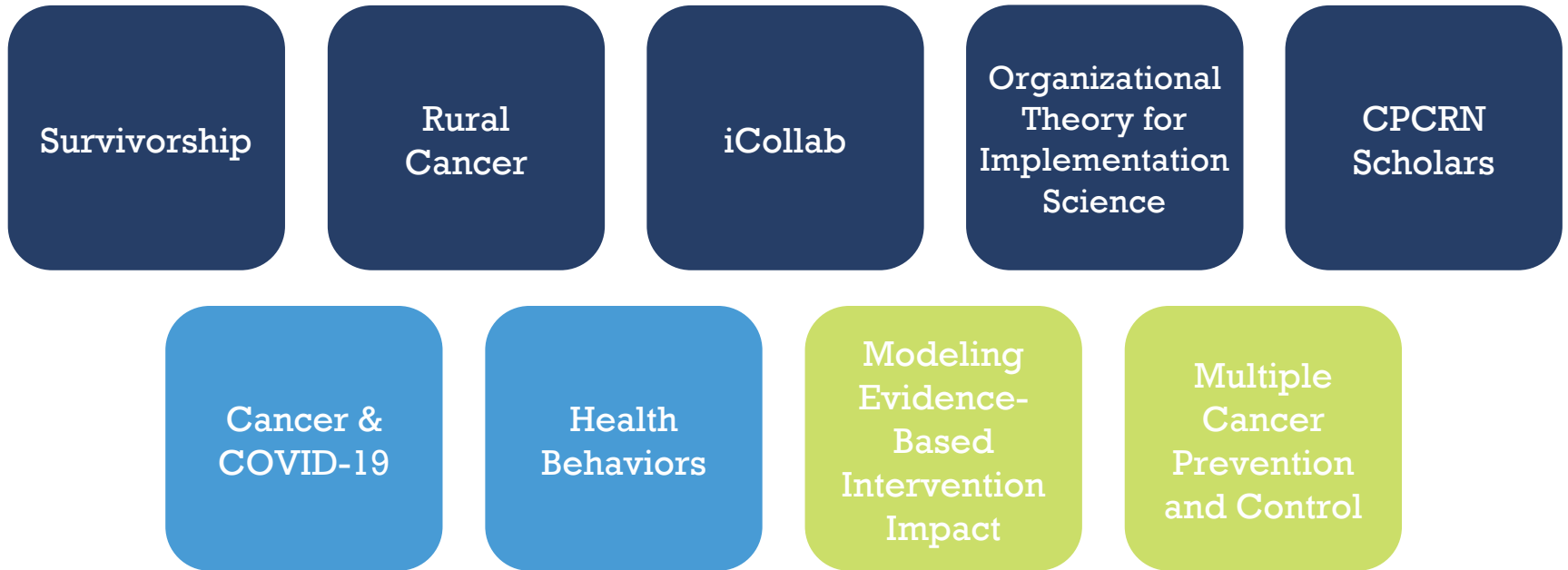
