Those that are not submitted in advance of the meeting may also be proposed during the CPCR5 Kickoff Meeting</li> <li>● Cross-center workgroup concepts may be related to or informed by Collaborating Center core project ideas, but should not be completely overlapping work. *going, and ideally to reach an initial consensus about concepts and who's going to lead them on Day 2. But in the past, and something I think we will continue with, is an open call for additional emerging ideas as we mature as a Network. We recognize that there is overlap among concepts that may emerge, and different Workgroups may have different lifecycles as well, so we want this to be an organic process. In Cycle 4, we had four new Workgroups that emerged as others sunsetted in the last two years of the Cycle.*

- [Risendal]: *Last time around, how many Workgroups did you end up with after the initial Annual Meeting?*
  - [Wheeler]: *There were two Workgroups that were signature projects, and these reflected Network involvement from all eight collaborating centers, in addition to several smaller Workgroups with 10-12 people each. Altogether, we ended up with five or six Workgroups.*
  - [Leeman]: *I don't think of an optimal number in terms of size. Rather, I think we should make sure that each Workgroup has a clear idea of commitment. One of the things I'm going to focus on is to specify what we're asking of people who intend to collaborate, to ensure that they're really invested and on the same page about how they will be asked to contribute.*
- [Askelson]: *Are there thoughts about how we can be more inclusive of our co-investigators who aren't there as we navigate that process of narrowing the focus of Workgroup concepts and leads?*

I would encourage you to gather information to get a sense of what their collaborative ideas might be, or in what capacity they might be interested in engaging.</i></li> <li>○ [Williams]: <i>We can also enable remote participation in that session so that, if you have investigators who are interested in being actively involved, they can contribute remotely.</i></li> </ul>
